

A Focus on Special Education

IRESA's Special Education PreSchool Ms. Felicity- Last Semester I was able to get the chance to work in the Pre School Special ED classroom. I picked up many skills including sign language, patience, and listening skills. I worked with kids who had low motor skills, hearing impairments ,and low or non-existent communication skills. My favorite part was making bonds with my students - their faces lit up when I walked in, they held my hand, and depended on me.

Mrs. Earl's Hearing Impaired Aalyah: Working with Mrs. Earl in Special Education, I realized that her class was not a classroom, but rather a familyroom. She has inspired me to work in Special Ed as well; to be a teacher like her. I learned many things, how to handle stressful situations, sign language, how to change a "feed" bag, and how to handle extremely stressful times. With all of that in mind, she helped me fall in love with working in Special Education.

Mrs. Davis' Elementary Inclusion Rotation Kylie: While working in Special Education I have noticed that these educators are spread very thin. They truly do everything - in a single day alone I helped out in six different classrooms. Even though I had to be all over the building I still had so much fun, and time to be silly with the kids(I am the one in the olaf suit to the right)
